

Turkey Decoded

Sweden's former ambassador to Turkey, Ann Dismorr, will give a lecture at Yale University on Feb. 23rd at 6pm in the Luce Hall Auditorium, 34 Hillhouse Avenue. Ann Dismorr is the author of *Turkey Decoded* (Saqi Books, London, 2008). Reception in the Common Room at 6:00 p.m. with *Turkey Decoded* available for purchase and signed by the Ambassador. Followed by lecture in the Auditorium at 6:30 p.m. The talk will be introduced and moderated by Sallama Shaker, a visiting scholar at Yale and the former Egyptian ambassador to Canada.

Turkey Decoded is written from the unique view point of one of the few female ambassadors to Turkey, covering topics from the Kurds to the Iraq War, women's and human rights, the crisis in Cyprus and the polarizing presidential election of 2007. Although EU membership talks were

launched more than three years ago and are anticipated to conclude in 2014, full membership is far from certain. Ambassador Dismorr will present an overview and in-depth presentation of Turkey Decoded, as well as personal and professional reflections on the topic.
